



PUBLIC NOTICE COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT

In accordance with the Copyright and Neighbouring Rights Act 19 of 2006 of Uganda, it is illegal to use artistic, scientific and literary works such as music, films, books, and computer programs without the explicit permission of the copyright owner or their representative. This law also applies to works from foreign jurisdictions.

The Uganda Police Force (UPF) and Uganda Registration Services Bureau (URSB), have been made aware that certain individuals and businesses are engaging in the unauthorized sale, distribution, importation, reproduction, public performance, or broadcast of copyrighted materials, which is a violation of the law and infringes upon the rights of copyright owners to earn income from their creative works.

The UPF and URSB are committed to promoting and protecting intellectual property rights in Uganda. As part of our mandate, we will be conducting random inspections of business premises across the country to seize any items or equipment being used in contravention of the law. Offenders will be prosecuted in accordance with the law.

The UPF and URSB urge all those using copyright-protected works to obtain a license from the following Collecting Societies, that are mandated to collect payments from users of works and distribute royalties to their members:

- 1. Uganda Performing Rights Society (UPRS) for the music industry;
- 2. Uganda Federation of Movie Industry (UFMI) for the film industry;
- 3. Uganda Reproduction Rights Organization (URRO) for writers and publishers

The UPF and URSB are dedicated to upholding the rule of law in Uganda and will take all necessary steps to enforce the rights of copyright owners.
